4-H Spring TRAP SHOOT RULES & REGULATIONS

GENERAL RULES AND INFORMATION

Date: May 6, 2017

Place: Duncan Gun Club, Duncan, OK

- **Trap shooting will start promptly at 9:00 a.m.**
- Awards will be presented at the conclusion of the shoot offs.

Shoot Fees - 50 targets = \$20.00 per shooter (includes costs of awards)

Also includes 10 practice rounds to be shot just prior to shooting 50 competition targets.

*(Make **one** check per county payable to Duncan Gun Club. Pay the day of the Event.)*

Age divisions (teams of 4 people)

Junior team = ages 10 – 11

Beginner team = ages 12-13

Senior team = ages 14 & up

Age division (individuals)

Ages 10 - 11

Ages 12 - 13

Ages 14 – 15

Ages 16 & up

***Ages are determined using members age as of January 1. Participants will be allowed to move up an age class to compete on a team . They may not compete on more than one team.

A member of a team will compete as an individual (in their age classification) for individual awards. Team and individual awards will be based on 50 target shots.

Tiebreaker decided as follows: Either by a Shoot-off or Longest Run

(will be announce at morning coaches meeting)

Shoot-Offs = 2 shots one each station (10 targets)

*A hotdog lunch will be provided free for shooters and available to spectators for donations

**** Following the Contest there will be a Wolf Chase Fundraiser to help offset cost of the event.**

SAFETY RULES

Both ear and eye protection is required to shoot.

Do not rest the gun on your toe.

Do not load the gun until it is your turn to shoot.

One shell in the gun at a time.

All certified instructors should assume the role of a safety officer.

Obey the instruction of the safety officers.

- We will need volunteers on hand to do the pulling and to serve as referees.
- No coaching during competition, only before.
- Shotguns may not be loaded or a shell chambered until it is the members turn to shoot.
- Live ammunition may not be placed (grounded) on the shooting pad. Shells are to be kept in members shooting pouch, vest, ect.
- *Bring your own ammunition: Legal Trap Loads only - (Maximum Load 12 gauge 1 1/8 oz, 3 dram equivalent of powder).*

THE MINIMUM AGE TO PARTICIPATE IN THE 4-H SHOOT WILL BE TEN (10) as of January 1, 2017.
Members should have received a minimum of 8 hours of instruction before the day of the shoot.

NOTICE

HUNTER SAFETY EDUCATION VERIFICATION

All participants must have completed the Hunter Education Safety Program to be eligible to participate in any 4-H Shooting Sports Contest.

Verification of Shooters: Extension Educators, Coordinators, or Coaches must submit a signed list of eligible shooters from the county: (1) verifying that they are 4-H Members, (2) having completed the hunter education safety program, and (3) having attended a minimum of 8 hours of instruction prior to the contest. We are no longer maintaining a file of the cards; your signature is legal verification that they have completed the course.

There will be no practice round before the competition. Shooters will be allowed 10 shots prior to starting their first round.

A copy of a RAM form, which should be in the hands of the respective coaches and leaders for each individual 4-H participant, can be downloaded from the Oklahoma 4-H shooting sports Website. These do not need to be submitted at registration time; however, in case of an emergency or accident, the coach/leader should have them easily accessible. Each county should secure their own activity insurance.

Safety plugs will be required.
