4-H CLUB FINANCIAL UNDERSTANDING



4-H is the Youth Development Program of the Oklahoma Cooperative Extension Service (OCES).

Extension professionals in cooperation with certified and trained adult 4-H volunteers provide leadership to clubs, Special Interest Groups (SPIN) and a county 4-H program. As a result, there is a measurable positive impact on enhancing the life skills of youth, parents, families and volunteers. This work fulfills the Oklahoma Cooperative Extension Service mission statement "to develop science-based educational programs to help Oklahomans solve local issues and concerns, promote leadership and manage resources wisely" and the Oklahoma 4-H program vision: We make Oklahoma better by creating opportunities for youth to develop leadership, citizenship and life skills, empowering youth to be productive citizens.

Only Chartered 4-H clubs and affiliates are authorized to use the 4-H Name and Emblem:

- Chartered 4-H Clubs agree to follow USDA and Oklahoma 4-H Name and Emblem guidelines for the purpose of: educational/informational programs, marketing and visibility and fund development which supports the educational function and the overall mission of the Oklahoma 4-H Program.
- 4-H Charters do not allow a recognized 4-H Club to share their rights and privileges, like the use of the 4-H name and Emblems, with any other person, group, or business.
- On materials that are originated, requested, purchased, distributed, or sold by them within their local area

A 4-H Charter represents an agreement within the context of the overall 4-H Program and have a two-fold purpose:

- 1) it is an agreement by the club with USDA and Oklahoma Cooperative Extension on the proper use of the 4-H Name and Emblem; and
- 2) it is an agreement by the club with Oklahoma State University and **(NAME)** County Extension office to follow and abide by all state and local 4-H policies, procedures, and other requirements.

Under U.S. Department of Agriculture and Oklahoma State University guidelines, the county Extension office is required to keep track of all transactions related to finances in 4-H clubs. It's expected that all 4-H clubs/groups/organizations using the name and emblem be transparent with financial records – that is show the source of any money raised and how it is disbursed.
