GROW IN YOUR PUBLIC SPEAKING PROJECT

The activities below are ideas to inspire project development. This is not a complete list.

BEGINNER

- Decide on a topic of interest for your presentation and find sources of information
- Work with a caring adult to develop a prepared presentation
- Learn the basic parts of a speech
- Observe a variety of public speaking styles by watching others' presentations

INTERMEDIATE

- Learn to make a good speech and presentation
- Teach others the basic skills and components of public speaking through workshops and one-onone mentoring
- Assist younger 4-H members in developing ideas for public speaking
- Develop good listening skills and habits

ADVANCED

- Assist with planning and implementing competitive speaking opportunities for 4-H members
- Provide educational programming by reaching out to non-4-H groups
- Learn appropriate style of citing sources for different presentation types
- Conduct interactive displays to promote 4-H

EXPAND YOUR EXPERIENCE

- · Practice mock interviewing with an adult for feedback
- Schedule a visit with a communications department at a university to see different forms of communication
- Evaluate presentations using appropriate rubrics
- Practice extemporaneous speaking skills
