General Rules

- Registration must be **emailed to ruth.pratt@okstate.edu and mailed** with payment made to Oklahoma 4-H Foundation 293 Ag. Hall Stillwater, OK 74078
- All registration and participation for this mail-in series will be individual participation, no teams
- Participants must be enrolled in 4-H and be of the appropriate age for the discipline entered.
- Participants must have completed their hunter's safety certification and their 8 hour first shot fundamentals with a certified 4-H Shooting Sports Instructor for the discipline being entered.
- Participants may enter more than one event but will pay \$10 per entry for each event entered.
- Participants may NOT enter one event multiple times or attempt the event multiple times.
- For Archery youth may enter more than one bow type but will pay a separate entry fee for each bow type entered. Participants may only enter more than one bow type at the discretion of the Certified Archery Instructor conducting the Mail-In Series and their Extension Educator.
- These Mail Ins can be conducted at any time during the window between receiving your targets/scorecards and the postmark due date listed above. They may be conducted with other counties invited or at your shooting sports practices, just please ensure it is before/after practice time and you are following all rules and time limits listed for these events. **THIS IS TO BE RAN JUST LIKE AN IN-PERSON CONTEST.** Only certified 4-H Shooting Sports instructors for the specific discipline may conduct this mail in contest.
- ORION will be used to score all events.
- Scorecards/Targets must be signed by a scorekeeper/coach and participant to be valid. Unsigned scorecards will be zeros. ORION will be used to score all events.
- All official scorecards/targets will be sent from the state office. If an unofficial scorecard/target is returned it will not be scored. This is to prevent multiple attempts or attempts to alter scores.
- All events for each discipline must be completed in one session with no more than a 5-minute break between events.
- All equipment and safety guidelines listed in the Oklahoma 4-H Shooting Sports rulebook will be followed.
- Awards - Medals will be awarded and mailed to the 1st place individuals in each class

2025 SPRING AIR RIFLE MAIL-IN CONTEST RULES

- Participants should have one 10-minute practice round in whichever position they prefer before the contest begins. No more practice rounds after the initial practice time is complete.
- We will mail you official targets for this event. Please use the official targets we send you.
- Equipment will follow the Oklahoma 4-H Air Rifle Rules
- The contest must be completed in one session with no more than a 5-minute break between events.
- Time limit of 10 minutes per target and 10 shots per target.
- Oklahoma 4-H Air Rifle Rules will be followed.
- Targets will be mailed/delivered to the Extension Educator on the registration sheet once payment has been submitted.

Scoring

- Scoring will be based on an integer system through ORION Scoring. ORION scanner will be used to score the targets.
- **Do not write on, score, plug or touch any targets/holes prior to mailing or handing in. Targets will be scored by a scanner once they are received. Sign the back of the target at the top for confirmation**
- For any disputed score the Oklahoma 4-H Shooting Sports Coordinator has the final call.
- For extra shots and crossfires, you will lose your highest score on that target.
- Ties will be broken by number of 10 x's, then by total number of 10s, number of 9s, and so on until the tie is broken or the tie stands.

STANDARD THREE-POSITION SPORTER AIR RIFLE

Target: ORION 12 Bull Air Rifle target

Target Height: **SENIORS ONLY:** Height to middle of target:
Prone – 19.75” Standing – 55” Kneeling – 31.50”
*Intermediate and junior can post their target where they need to within reason

Distance: 10 meters or 33 feet

Course of Fire: 3 x 10. 10 shots each position: prone, standing, and kneeling in that order. (30 record shots)

Time Limit: 1 minute per record shot, 10 minutes per target.

SPORTER AIR RIFLE STANDING ONLY (Seniors and Intermediates)

Target: ORION 12 Bull Air Rifle target

Target Height: **SENIORS ONLY:** Height to middle of target:
Standing – 55”
*Intermediate can post their target where they need to within reason

Distance: 10 meters or 33 feet

Course of Fire: 3 x 10. 30 shots while standing. Will be shot in 3 rounds with 10 shots per target. (30 record shots)

Time Limit: 1 minute per record shot standing, 10 minutes per target.

- We will mail you official targets for this event. Please use the official targets we send you.
- Equipment will follow the Oklahoma 4-H Air Pistol Rules
- The contest must be completed in one session with no more than a 5-minute break between events.

SLOW FIRE BULLSEYE AIR PISTOL

Target: ORION Air Pistol 1 bull target

Target Height: **SENIORS ONLY:** Height to middle of target:
Standing – 55”
*Intermediate can post their target where they need to within reason

Distance: 10 meters or 33 feet

Course of Fire: One handed hold, standing. 10 shots per target, 2 targets, 20 shots total

Time Limit: 1 minute per record shot, 5 minutes per target.

SINGLE SHOT RAPID FIRE AIR PISTOL

Target: ORION Air Pistol 1 bull target

Target Height: **SENIORS ONLY:** Height to middle of target:
Standing – 55”
*Intermediate can post their target where they need to within reason

Distance: 10 meters or 33 feet

Course of Fire: One handed hold, standing. 10 shots per target, 2 targets, 20 shots total

Time Limit: Timed fire: Load Command: 20 seconds to load firearm with single pellet, charge if needed and grip the pistol (Ruth has a recording she can share if you want it)

Ready Command: 7 seconds at “Ready” position
Start Command: “Start”, then 3 seconds to fire the shot.
Stop Command: “Stop” announced after the 3 second period.

Late Fired Shot: The participant will be penalized their highest score on the bullseye they are currently shooting for each late shot. Another shot will be taken on the same bullseye to replace the late shot taken.

- Participants should have one practice round of 5 arrows prior to starting the contest at the farthest distance only! No more practice arrows once that practice round is complete.
- Each county is responsible for purchasing target faces. Contact Ruth for information on where to purchase. The following target faces may be used:
 - Seniors: 122cm face, 5-color face
 - Intermediates: 122 cm face, 5-color face
 - Juniors 122 cm face, 5-color face
- Equipment will follow Oklahoma 4-H Archery Rules
- Contest must be shot in one session with a 5-minute break at the halfway point.
- Time-limit of 3 ½ minutes per 5 arrow end.
- Oklahoma 4-H Archery Outdoor Rules and Classes will be followed.
- Scorecards will be mailed/emailed to the Extension Educator on the registration sheet once payment has been submitted.

Scoring

- Scoring will be 10x, 10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1. As marked on the target face. If the arrow touches the line, the higher value will be awarded.
- All arrows must remain in the target butt until all arrows are scored. Arrows touched before they are scored will be a zero.
- For any disputed score the Chief Range Officer has the final call
- Ties will be broken by number of 10 x's, then by total number of 10s, number of 9s, and so on until the tie is broken or the tie stands.

FITA ROUND

- Target:** **Seniors:** 122 cm face, 5-color face
 Intermediates: 122 cm face, 5-color face
 Juniors: 122 cm face, 5-color face
- Distance:** **Seniors:** 60, 50, 40, and 30 meters
 Intermediates: 40, 30, 20 yards
 Juniors: 25, 20, 15 yards
- Course of Fire:** **Seniors:**
2 ends of 5 arrows each from 60, 50, 40 & 30 meters @ 122 cm targets
(equal to 66 yards, 55 yards, 44 yards and 33 yards)
- Intermediates:**
2 ends of 5 arrows each from 40, 30 and 20 yards @ 122 cm targets
- Juniors:**
1 end of 5 arrows each from 25, 20 and 15 yards @ 122 cm targets
- Time Limit:** 3 ½ minutes per 5 arrow end
- Scoring:** 10x-1 from the center outward, inner 10's will be scored. **Coaches will score targets.**

2025 SPRING TRAP, SKEET MAIL-IN CONTEST RULES

- (Participants do not have to register for both shotgun events, but putting them together here will save space)
- Participants should have practice rounds (outlined below) before the contest begins. Once the contest begins there will be no additional practice rounds
 - For Trap 1 practice round from each station
 - For Skeet Two practice rounds each at stations #1, #4 and #7. Participants choice of singles or double.
- We will mail/email you official scorecards for this event. Please use the official scorecards we send you.
- Equipment and ammunition will follow the Oklahoma 4-H Shotgun Rules
- Trap will be 2 rounds of 25, and skeet will be 2 rounds of 25. Both rounds of each event must be completed in one session with no more than a 5-minute break between rounds. You may hold trap and skeet on 2 different dates.
- Oklahoma 4-H Shotgun rules will be followed.
- Scorecards will be mailed/mailed to the Extension Educator on the registration sheet once payment has been submitted.

Scoring

- Scorekeepers will call hits/losses. Any dispute must be called to the attention of the Chief Range officer immediately to verify between the puller and scorekeeper what was seen. There will be no disputing scores later.
- For any disputed score the Chief Range Officer has the final call.
- Scoring will be on a hit or miss basis. Hits must consist of a visible piece of the target is broken or separated from the target. Target change of direction or dusting is NOT a visible piece and will be scored as a miss.
- For trap and skeet, ties will be broken by longest run of hits from the beginning of the first round, then by least number of misfires, if tie can't be broken we will award multiple certificates and pins.

NRA THREE-POSITION .22 RIFLE

Target: NRA A-51

Distance: 50 yards

Course of Fire: 10 shots in each position (prone, standing, kneeling/sitting in that order) at 50 yards. 30 shots total

Time Limit: 1 minute per record shot in each position, 10 minutes per position.

CMP SPORTER .22 RIFLE

Note: In Rapid Fire stages: after the “Load” command, all actions must be locked open prior to the “Start” command. Manually holding the action open is not permitted. **Participants will start each stage standing then get into position after the "Start" command is given. Actions may not be unlocked or closed until the participant is in the firing position and the firearm safely pointed down range after the “Start” command is given.**

Target: B-19 CMP Rimfire Sporter Target

Distance: 25 yards and 50 yards

Course of Fire: 30 shots for record

50 yards - Prone position - 5 shots, Slow fire & 5 shots, rapid fire
Sitting/Kneeling – 5 shots slow fire & 5 shots rapid fire

25 yards
Standing – 5 shots slow fire & 5 shots rapid fire

Time Limit: Slow fire- 1 shot per minute;

Rapid fire- 5-shot strings in **25 seconds** (semi-auto) or **30 seconds** for manual repeater.

Distance: 25 yards

Course of Fire: One handed standing position, All slow-fire, 30 record shots at 25 yards

Time Limit: 1 minute per record shot, 10 minutes per 10 shots.

MODIFIED CAMP PERRY ROUND

Target: NRA B-8

Distance: 25 yards

Course of Fire: One handed standing position, 15 timed fire and 15 rapid fire, 30 shots for record

Time Limit: Timed fire – 20 seconds per 5 shot string
Rapid fire – 10 seconds per 5 shot string
