

Evidence samples for use at Crime Scenes

General Instructions / Recommendations:

Print out samples and cut / tear apart to leave as evidence at the crime scenes.

For fingerprints and DNA samples, recommend printing on sticker paper and sticking to the cups/plates.

Feel free to replace trace evidence with more realistic examples, for examples OSU / 4-H SWAG or promotional items, orange fur, etc.

Recommend writing the “letter” of the crime scene on the back/bottom of the different evidence pieces to keep things together.

Recommend adding some cookies crumbs / sprinkles to the plate for added realism!

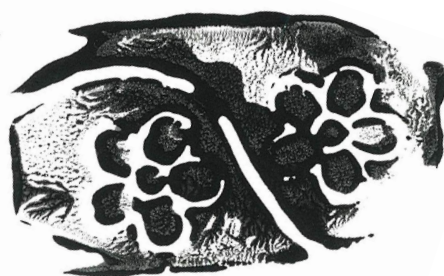

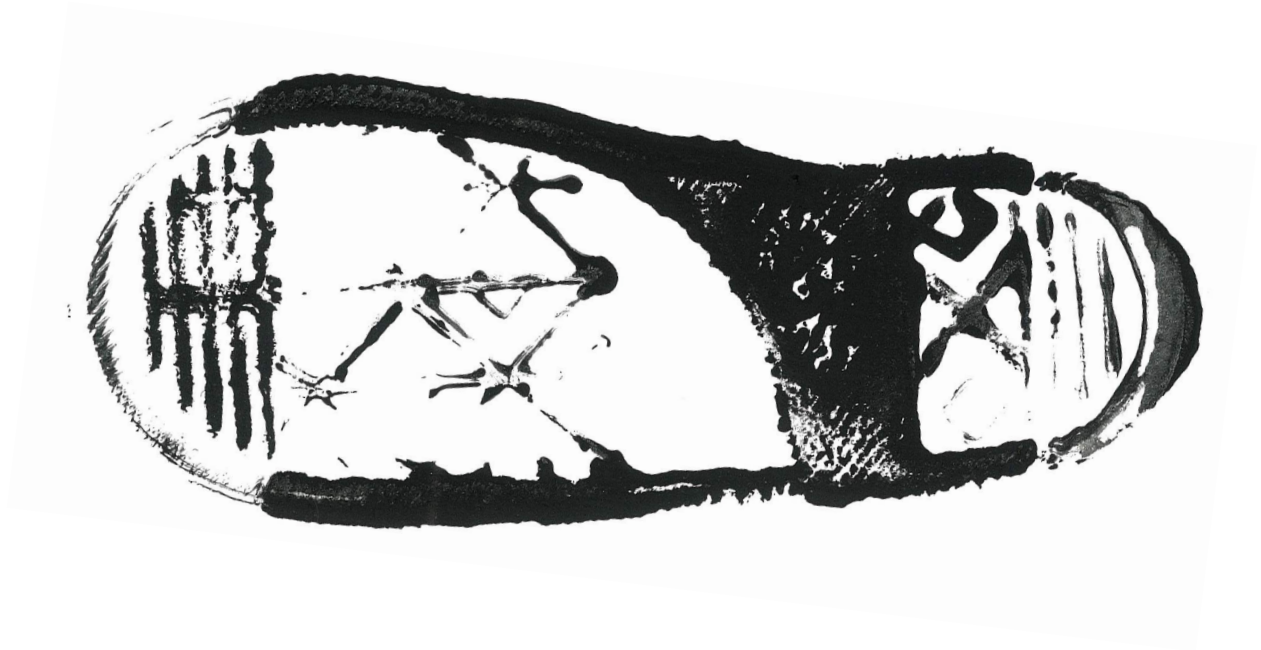

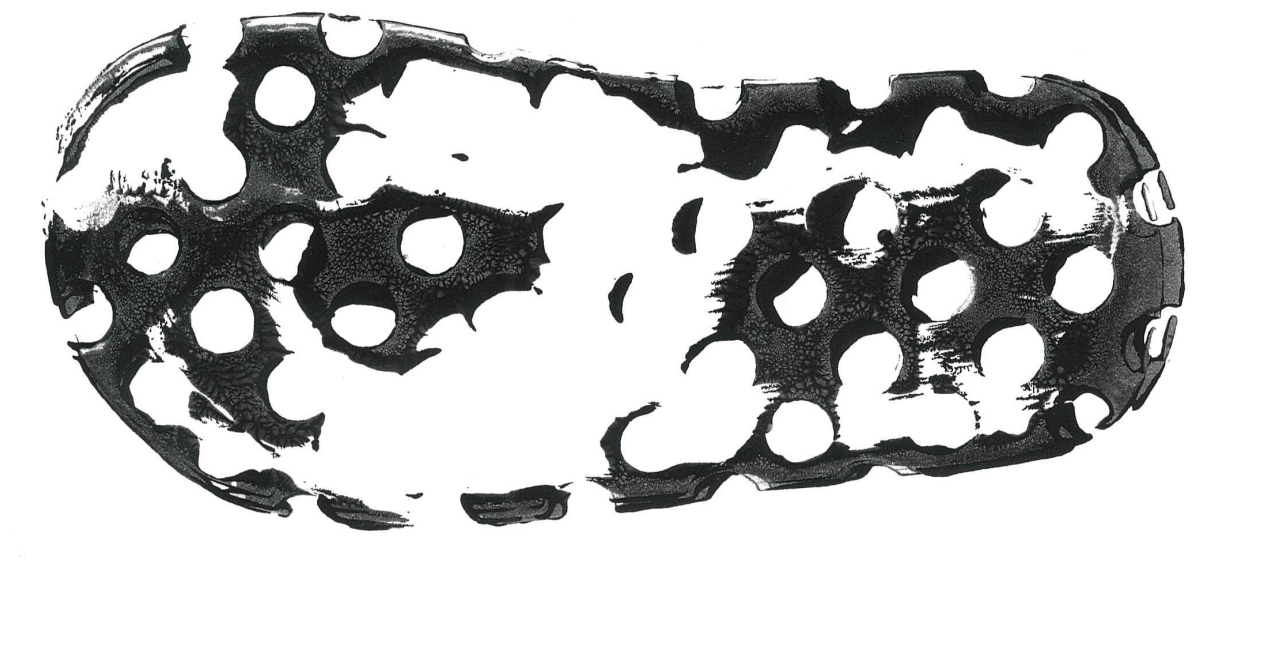

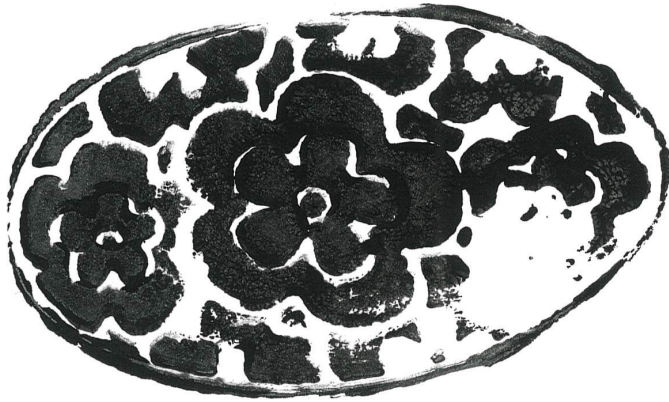
